We had good traveling, no snow in Illinois, but lots of rain nearly all the way to Memphis. Eating took a little longer than we thought (the Underdahl's GPS told us nearly 3 hours out of the trip!) but everyone is well! Today, after we gather for worship at 9:30am here in the motel, we will travel another 5 hours south through Mississippi to Biloxi, and should arrive there in late afternoon. Thank you for your prayers as we travel and look forward to serving here in Biloxi.

Hello Everyone,

Once again a late night. We arrived in Biloxi late this afternoon, just in time to join with the church in their evening worship service. Amazing friendships were made in that short week last summer, and for Sherri who has had so many trips here, it is like old home week! Upon arrival, we promptly registered for the week with the church, and 4 of us went out to look at the projects for the week. There are many. The church here is seeing finances fade as the economy struggles and awareness of need for Katrina diminishes. Therefore we will be involved in wrapping up projects on 3 homes currently under construction with many small jobs, rather than larger more focused projects. They don't want to overspend and start projects they cannot finish....good biblical counsel! After surveying the construction sites, we returned to the church and set about the task of mobilizing 33 midwesterners in Katrina construction! Tomorrow we'll see how it works! Late this evening at about 9pm we wrapped up the day with worship and devotions and now all but a few are sound asleep.

As one of our people put it, "it is so humbling to see the way God is working down here". The diligence and commitment of this small church, matched with the infinite power of God is an amazing thing to behold! And we are just a small part of what God is doing, not only here, but around the country and world! Here in Biloxi, this little church continues to change the way people see God, by sacrificially building homes for those who are in deep need. Isn't that what a church is supposed to do? The truth of Jesus is nothing about religion, but instead is everything about seeing people become "new creations" in Christ! What can you do? Please pray for us that God will use us to be a blessing and help to the work here. Pray that this will be not just a "mission trip", but truly a "God" event in our lives and in the lives of those we serve and meet. But more than that, pray that God will be glorified to the people whose homes we are building. What good does it do a man to gain a home and go to a Christ-less eternity?

May He be praised in all that we do here! We'll update you as much as we can!

- 1) some of us continued to rake out (NEVERENDING) oyster shells from the "high" house. (high = 10 feet off the ground).
- 2) another group went to the "cat" house (30 cats, ahhh!) and mowed the lawn, weed wacked, and did other miscellaneous yard work chores. some finished up the painting job and happy to know that the house is just about finished and the owners will be able to move in soon!! :)
- 3) another small group of men were stationed at the "rat" house (swamped with rats following the hurricane) today. they dug a trench for water drainage, fixed a fence, removed a stump fool of fire ants, reset a tree, yard work, and landscaping.
- 4) this afternoon we had a group build a play ground set for the church because their other set was taken away by Hurricane Gustav last year.

all in all we had a very good day. we not only were able to get lots of projects completed but also had great conversations with the locals and also grew closer to each other as the PCC group. we've enjoyed our trip and are awed by what God is doing down here. how GREAT and POWERFUL He is!!!!!! :)
